Under the National Law, registrants are able to practise while their renewal application is being processed. Practitioners also remain registered for one month after their registration expiry date. If the practitioner's name appears on the Register, they are registered and can practise (excepting practitioners with a Registration Type of 'non-practising' or those with a condition which stops them from practising, or where their registration is suspended).

Conditions:

- Prohibition on access to medication
 - The Practitioner must not prescribe/possess/supply/administer (hereafter referred to as access), the following substances: thyroid hormone therapy of any type, including Natural Thyroid Extract.
 - Within 14 days of the notice of imposition of these conditions the Practitioner must provide to AHPRA:
 - On the form provided, written confirmation from and the contact details of the Senior Practice Manager at each and every current place of practice that they are aware that AHPRA will contact them for the purposes of the reports outlined in (b). With any subsequent new place of practice the Practitioner must, within three days, provide to AHPRA written confirmation and the contact details of the senior person at each and every subsequent place of practice that they are aware that AHPRA will contact them for the purposes of the reports outlined in (b).
 - Written acknowledgement that AHPRA will seek reports from each and every one of the senior persons named in (a) on a three monthly basis. Reports may also be sought at other times as required by AHPRA or the Board or where the senior person holds a concern or becomes aware of a concern about the Practitioner's competence, conduct or fitness to practise the profession.
 - Written acknowledgement that AHPRA may have contact with and access information from Medicare Australia and/or local drug and poisons regulatory authorities in relevant states or territories in order to monitor compliance with this restriction.
 - If, in the event of a medical emergency, the Practitioner is unable to comply with a condition, any such incident must be notified to AHPRA within two business days. The condition must be such that compliance with it would directly impact upon the Practitioner's ability to provide care that would have a direct benefit to a patient in a medical emergency. For the purposes of these conditions a medical emergency is an event where it is not possible or reasonable to have a patient with a serious or life threatening condition seen by another practitioner or transferred to the nearest hospital. Any non compliance with a condition due to medical emergency not notified to AHPRA within two business days will be treated as a breach of these conditions and reported to the Board who may take further action in relation to a breach of conditions.
 - Within 14 days of the notice of the imposition of these conditions, the Practitioner is to provide to AHPRA, on the form provided, the details of any and all places of practice, together with, where relevant, confirmation from the Senior Practice Manager at each and every place of practice that they have sighted a copy of these conditions.
 - With each and every subsequent place of practice the Practitioner must, within seven days of the commencement of practice, provide to AHPRA the details of the subsequent place of practice together with written confirmation, where relevant, from the senior person at each and every subsequent place of practice that they have sighted a copy of these conditions.
 - With each and every subsequent alteration to these conditions the Practitioner must, within seven days of the notice of alteration of these conditions, provide to AHPRA, written confirmation from the senior person, where relevant, at each and every place of practice that they have sighted a copy of the altered conditions.
 - Unless expressly provided for within a condition, all costs associated with compliance with these conditions are at the Practitioner's own expense.
